

Computer Lab Behavior Contract

An important component of computer class is making sure each student takes responsibility for treating the technology with respect. Each class period, students are graded on their "citizenship" in the lab. The expectations are as follows:

- Enter quietly, log on, follow directions listed on the projector or listen for verbal instructions, adjust chair and monitor appropriately. 1 pt
 - Work quietly and respectfully throughout class period 3 pts
 - Make sure your workstation is properly cleaned up 1 pt
 - Log off or shut down, as instructed
 - Chair pushed in
 - Keyboard out to the edge of the table
 - Mouse on mouse pad
 - Monitor returned to proper position
 - Personal belongings picked up, no garbage left behind

Other notes:

- If you are absent during a class period, you will have the opportunity to earn the 5 points if you schedule a 15 minute make-up, either during the morning from 7:30-8:00 AM, or during your morning or lunch recess. If you do not complete the scheduled makeup session, you will get a **0** for that missing class period. Arrangements to make up the time must be made within a week of your absence.
- If you come in and your computer workstation is not in the appropriate condition, you must tell the teacher **before** you begin working.
